- A. Position of a part of the French Army, forming its Rear Guard at the Village of Redinha, on the 12<sup>th</sup> of March, 1811.
- a. French Troops posted to cover the Retreat of the Rear Guard over the bridge of Redinha.
- B. The main part of the French Army retiring towards Condeixa.
- b. The French Rear Guard retiring on the advance of the line of attack formed by the Allies.
- C. Head of the Column of the Allied Army in march from Pombal, 12<sup>th</sup> March, 1811.
- D. The Light division moved out from the Column to dislodge the enemy's advanced posts from a Pine Wood on the left of the line of march.
- E. The 3<sup>rd</sup> division making a movement to the right, through a Wood, by which its march was concealed from the view of the enemy.
- F. B<sup>r</sup> Gen. Puck's brigade moving to take up a position on the edge of the wood, between the columns of march on the main road, and the 3<sup>rd</sup> Division.
- G. Formation of a part of the Allied Army moving forward to attack the Enemy.
