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 This Great Empire was begun to be surveyed by the Jesuit Missionaries 4th of July 1708 & finished the 1st of Jan. 1717. The Province of Pe-che-li was done by P.P. Regis, Sarrasin & Fridelli from 4th of December 1709 to the 28th of June 1710. Shan-si & Shen-si in 1712 by Yang-shi Quang-tong & Quang-shi in 1714 by P.P. de Tartre and Cordosa. Ho-nan, Kyang-nan, Che-kyang & Fo-kyen, by P.P. Regis, de Meila and Holderer in 1713 & 1714. Se-chwen & Yun-nan by P.P. Fridelli, Bonjour an Augustinian and Regis; in 1714 & 1715. Quey-chew & Hu-quang; by P.P. Fridelli and Regis in 1716.
 They determined the Latitudes of above 500 Cities &c. by Observations, and their Longitudes by the method of Triangles; being also assisted by the Maps and Histories preserved in the Tribunals of their Cities &c. the Informations of the Mandarins &c. as well as the Chiefs of the People thro' whose Territories they passed.
